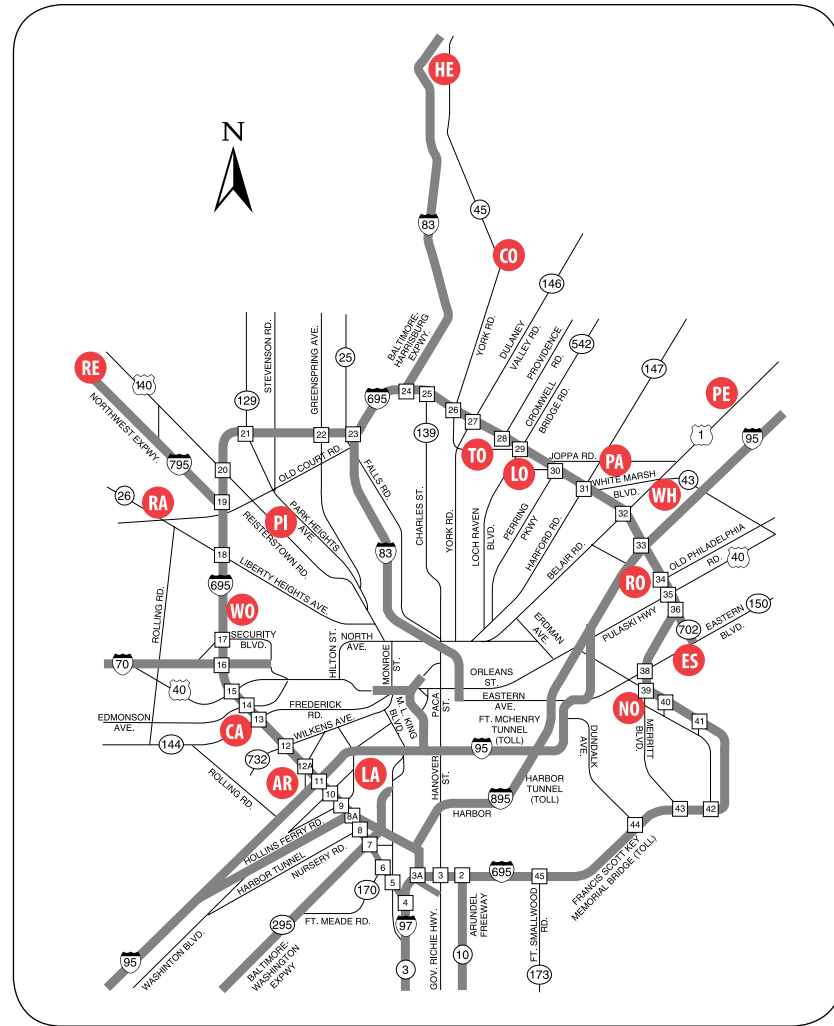

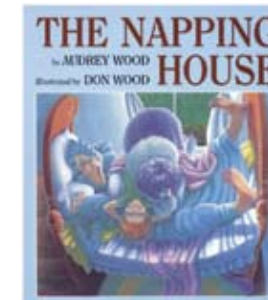


When Mom or Dad asks what you did today, you can tell them ReadRover came to read and play!

By: Audrey Wood

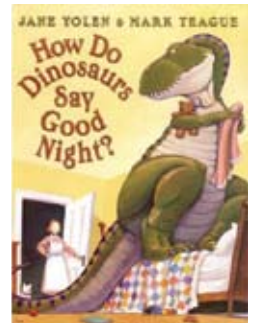
In this cumulative tale, a

By: Jane Yolen

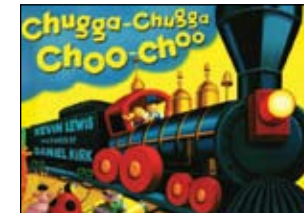
A silly rhyming story about the

By: Kevin Lewis

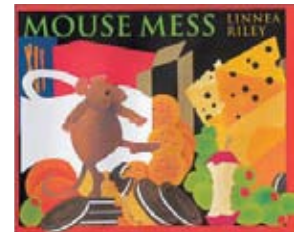
A rhyming story about a

By: Linnea Riley

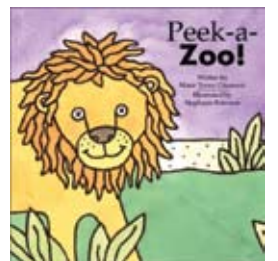
A hungry mouse leaves a

By: Keith Faulkner

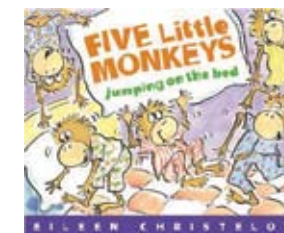
Increasingly larger animals,

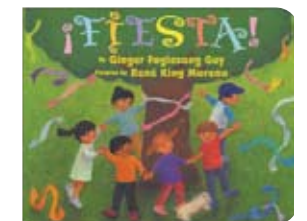
A counting book in which one

Reading with Your Child

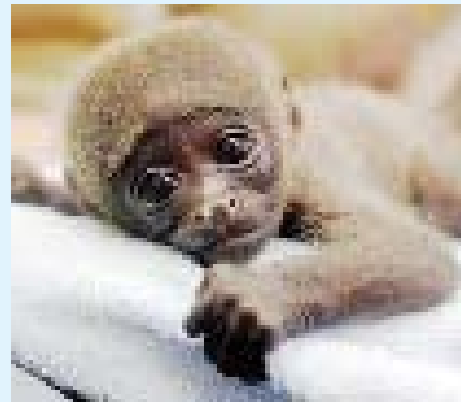
Look for books that are about things that interest your child. For example, does your child like cars, insects or animals? Snuggle with your child with her favorite blanket or toy as you read.
