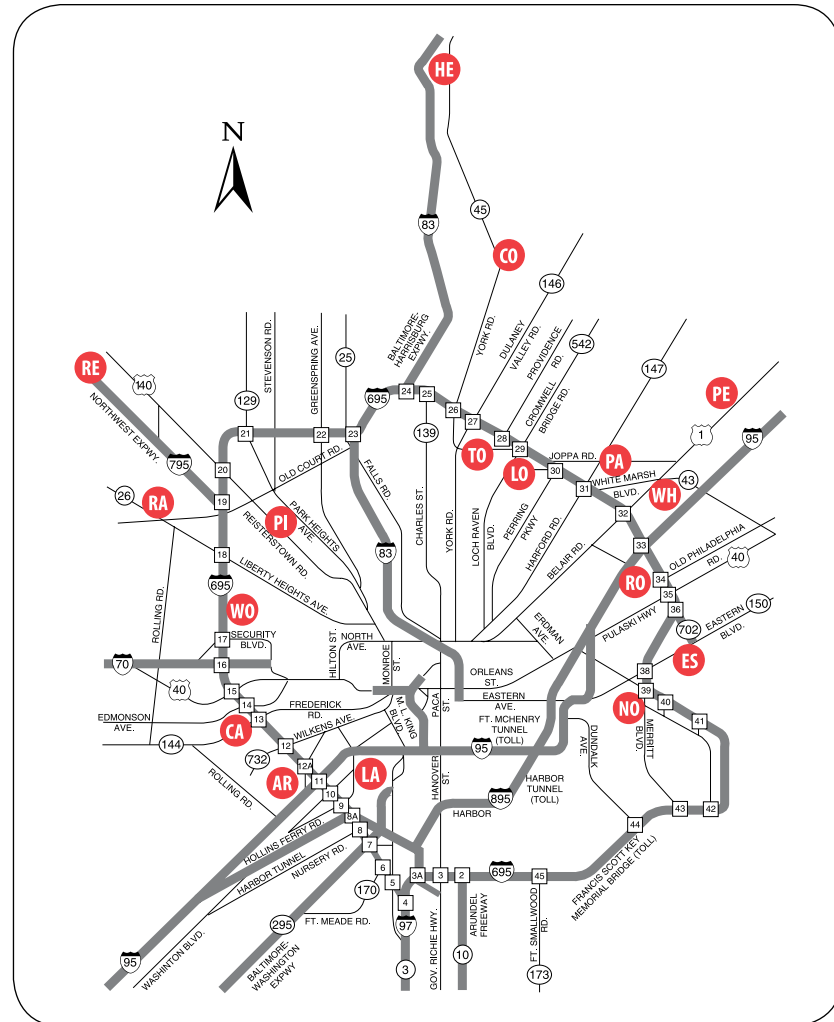

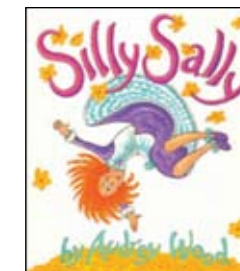
When Mom or Dad asks what you did today, you can tell them ReadRover came to read and play!

By: Audrey Wood

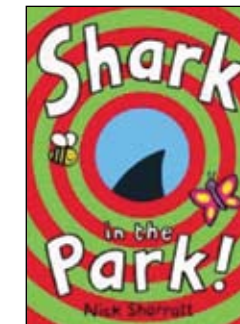
A rhyming story of Silly Sally, who makes many friends as she travels to town—backwards and upside down.

By: Keith Faulkner

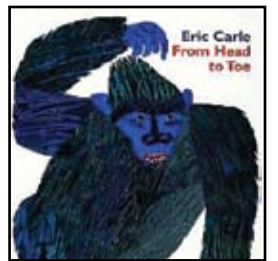
Poor hippo has a horrible case of the hiccups! Only when the animals put their heads together do they find the right solution.

By: Eric Carle

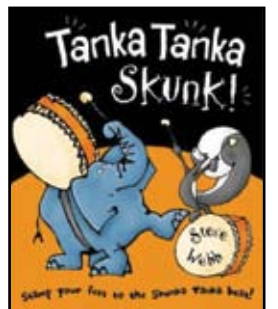
Encourages the reader to exercise by following the movements of various animals; presented in a question and answer format.

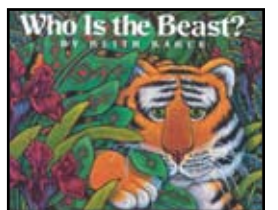
Stamp your feet to the Skunka Tanka beat!

By: Keith Baker

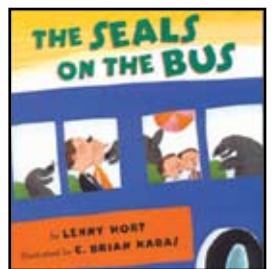
When a tiger suspects he is the beast the jungle animals are fleeing from, he returns to them and points out their similarities.

Bite off a finger!

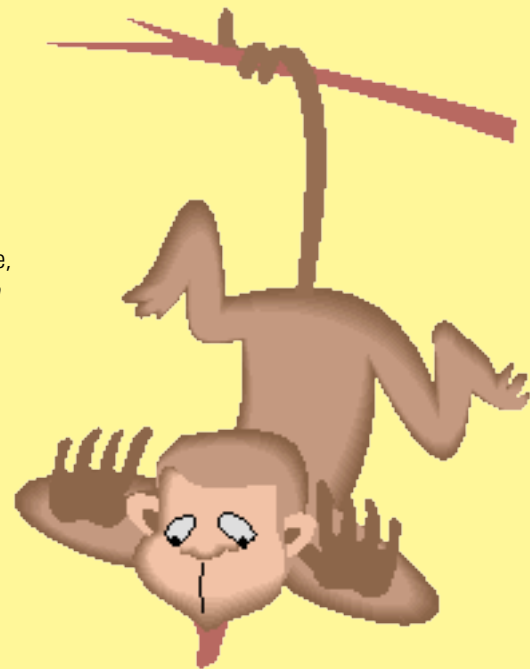
Four little monkeys...
