As we begin another year of working together to make the Towson Library an exciting destination for readers of all ages, plans are underway to provide a slate of programs that are fun and interesting for all of the family. While our programs for children, especially babies and preschoolers, have been tremendously successful, we are trying to reach a wider audience in the community. With the assistance of funding donated to the Towson Library through the hard work and generosity of the Friends of the Towson Library, we are able to provide materials, snacks, and appearances by talented performers so that our customers can enjoy programs that are both educational and entertaining.

Last June, for the kickoff program to Summer Reading 2013, we had a fantastic Circus Night at the Library, featuring acrobats and jugglers—with flaming batons! The main floor of the library became the Big Top for one night, as more than 300 people attended, one of our biggest programs ever. The kids joined in the fun, learning to juggle with bean bags and were treated to cookies and punch.

This Fall, we have begun a series of “Teen Open Mic” nights. The first one drew more than 27 people. Teens loved the opportunity to showcase their singing,

ukulele-playing, rapping, and dancing talents. They couldn’t wait to tell their friends to come to the next one! Pizza and soft drinks were a smash hit, courtesy of the Friends of the Towson Library.

Craft programs for school-age children are always a hit, and offer kids the opportunity to express their creativity. This month, they created fall-themed felt banners while listening to stories of the season. On December 7, the ever-popular “Build a Gingerbread House” will feature candy and holiday tales. In February, children can create their own take-home snowman, with no mittens required. Craft materials and treats for the children are all provided through the generosity of the Friends.

For all members of the family, we have two performers coming to enthrall with their impersonation of famous historical figures. On January 16, Ben Franklin will be discussing his numerous inventions, and on April 17, Emily Dickinson will be reading aloud some of her favorite poems, in celebration of National Poetry Month.

All of these exciting activities enliven the offerings of the Towson Library, providing amusement, learning, and family togetherness—thanks to the Friends of the Towson Library.

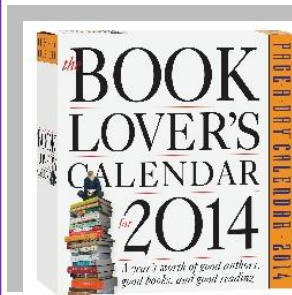
Friends of the Towson Library is pleased to assist the Towson Branch in its work with Turning Pages

The *Turning Pages Family Reading Club* is a special contact visiting time for inmates of the Baltimore County Detention Center to read to and do literacy activities with their children. Children take the books and activities home with them to keep. The families meet four times over eight weeks at visitation facilities of the BCDC.

Inmates are invited to participate on the basis of good behavior, an interview, commitment to the Turning Pages contract, a cooperative caregiver, and possibly a lottery. The children are between the ages of 4 and 12 (or 6th grade). Caregivers make this possible by bringing the children and participating. The leaders are experienced, professional educators.

In preparatory workshops, inmates learn how to help their children become great readers, pick books to read and plan an activity. Fathers and children will read together, do a book-related activity and participate in a family activity. Caregivers gather to chat about supporting their children in school and raising successful readers. A professional educator leads.
